



Equal Playing Field was founded in 2011 by Adam Everill (Australia) and Jacqui Joseph (PNG), after they met at the British Council 's Global Changemakers Forum. Since this time, EPF has grown and developed into a fully operational not-for-profit organisation, registered with the Australian Charities and Not for Profits Commission (ACNC) in Australia and with the Investment Promotion Authority (IPA) in PNG.

EPF is founded on the belief that violence against women is preventable and that frank and open discussions about gender equality and respectful relationships during adolescence have the power to stop violence against women before it happens by changing attitudes and behaviours that allow violence against women to occur. EPF's understanding of Violence Against Women is gender based and informed by the World Health Organisation's Ecological Model, which states that violence against women occurs because of a complex interaction of multiple risk factors at an individual, relationship, community and society levels. All of these risk factors are enabled by widespread gender inequality that substantially increases women's vulnerability to violence.

While Equal Playing Field programs and advocacy initiatives reach men, women, boys and girls, the organisation has a specific focus on working with men and boys to define healthy, positive and non-violent expressions of masculinity that create stronger, safer, happier communities. To achieve this, EPF uses sport of all kinds to engage young people and educate communities in conversations about gender equality, respectful relationships and violence against women

Pacifika Women Network (PWN) started as an avenue for women from all over the Pacific, especially the smaller Pacific countries that were not part of APEC, to be able to participate in this event. This was the trigger that led to the establishment of the PWN Trade Centre.

Women struggle to do business and more so able to grow and sustain their businesses. One of the major hurdles is that women apart from working or doing business, look after the children and manage the household. They actually do many other small activities to generate additional income to support the main income, but they are individual efforts. However, if women connect with other women within their peer groups but more importantly outside their peer groups they will become a force to reckon with as women in numbers are greater in strength and more influential. The opportunity to network and connect presented itself with the establishment of PWN.

The founder, Mrs. Ruth Undi wanted women to be able to connect and do business with each other more freely. She saw the strength and absolute influence and control in getting all women networks connected as many women are self-employed, especially in the informal sector in the food industry. For example, in Papua New Guinea annual food production, largely the responsibility of women, has been valued at US\$55 million a year. In Samoa, 80 percent of the private sector is comprised of micro businesses, and women are estimated to head over 40 percent of them.

This in itself presents opportunities to the women that if they all get together and work as a network, they can secure contracts to supply mines, supermarkets within the region and internationally. Using this as a springboard concept PWN was born.


